Scripture- Ephesians 1:15-23 CTW- Ps 47

Sermon- Open the Eyes of My Heart, Lord

Hymns 459, 671, 272

Theme- The Holy Spirit opens the eyes of the heart and enables people to change their perspectives so they can creatively visualize everything that God wants to do through them. Ask the Lord to help you to be willing to change your perspective by the enabling power of the Spirit so you can VISUALIZE EVERYTHING God wants to do through you.

I. Introduction: We Need The Right Perspective

A. Food For Thought:

When Goliath came against the Israelites, the soldiers all thought, "He's so big we can never kill him."

David looked at the same giant and thought, "He's so big I can't miss." **God Can Make It Happen!**

A shoe manufacturer who decided to open the Congo market sent two salesmen to the undeveloped territory. One salesman cabled back: "Prospects here are nil. No one wears shoes."

The other salesman reported enthusiastically, "Market potential here is terrific! Everyone is barefooted!"

II. How Do YOU Look at It?

A. The Holy Spirit helps you visualize the possibilities in people, places and ministry situations. Robert Kennedy said, "Some people see things as they are. I try to see things as they could be."

Jesus was inspired by the Holy Spirit to see the potential in twelve ordinary men who would be used of God to help build Christ's church.

Paul wrote, "You are members of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone." (**Eph. 2:20**) Ask the Lord to help you to creatively visualize potential, possibilities and capabilities in everything and everyone.

B. Charles Stanley shares how he was a skinny, uncoordinated young lad who never got picked until dead last in pick-up ball games. He languished in mediocrity until he started visualizing what God wanted him to become.

The rest is a story of Christ creating in him a marvelous example of a re-working into someone who influenced millions for Christ-likeness by teaching them to see things in a different light, **using** the power of God's word.

B. The Holy Spirit motivates us to try new things so we can see beyond our present horizons. Jesus sent 72 disciples out two by two ahead of him to every town where he was preach. He told them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest to send workers into his harvest field." Ask the Lord for more creative wisdom, knowledge and perspectives to motivate others to creatively visualize everything that God wants to do through them.

A Maine farmer was approached by a stranger one day and asked how much he thought his prize Jersey cow was worth. The farmer thought for a moment, looked the stranger over, then said: "Are you the tax assessor, or has she been killed by your car?"

C. The Holy Spirit encourages us to be willing to take

creative risks by faith regardless of the shame, difficulty, or suffering we may have to endure. Paul wrote of Abraham, "He staggered not as the promise of God through unbelief. But, he grew strong in faith being fully persuaded that He had power to do what He had promised."

Ask the Lord to strengthen your faith so that you can follow Abraham who risked great shame, difficulty and suffering knowing God was able to provide the power to fulfill all of His promises.

Woodrow Wilson said "I would rather lose in a cause that will someday win, than win in a cause that will someday lose.

D. The Holy Spirit wants to provide healing and deliverance for those who are creatively able to visualize new ways that God can restore them to health.

One day a Canaanite woman came crying to Jesus, "Lord, have mercy on me. My daughter is suffering terribly from demonpossession. The disciples said, 'Send her away.' She came and knelt before Jesus and said, "Even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table.' Then Jesus answered, 'Woman, you have great faith! Your request is granted.' And her daughter was healed from that very hour." (Matt. 15:22-28)

Moral of the Story: Be creative when you ask the Lord for healing in new ways that others might not have thought of before. **The Lord rewards creative faith.**

E. The Holy Spirit urges us to visualize greater ways that the Lord can use us to multiply Christ's kingdom and righteousness throughout the earth. Jesus said, "Do you not say, 'Four months more and then the harvest? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest."

(John 4:35) Ask the Lord to help you to open your eyes to ALL

the possibilities that lie in front of you to multiply Christ's kingdom, righteousness and truth throughout the world.

- F. The Holy Spirit enables people to change their perspectives so they can creatively visualize everything that God wants to do through them. Paul wrote, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is his good, pleasing and perfect will." (Rom. 12:2) Ask the Lord to help you to be willing to change your perspective by the enabling power of the Spirit so you can visualize EVERYTHING God wants to do through you.
- G. The Holy Spirit teaches us that if people want to see God work in new ways they must be willing to believe God CAN work greater wonders through their relationships and ministries. Jesus said, "Anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father." (John 14:12) Ask the Lord to help you daily to be willing to believe God can work greater wonders through your personal life, relationships and ministries.
- H. The Holy Spirit tempers your creativity so that you do not let speculations, imaginations or visions of greatness determine your sense of well-being. Paul wrote, "To keep me from becoming conceited because of these surpassingly great revelations, there was given me a thorn in my flesh." (2 Cor. 12:7) Thank the Lord for the way that He chooses to temper your creative visualizations for your own best interests.
- I. The Holy Spirit helps us be willing to strip ourselves of certain dependencies so we are free to be completely empowered by God instead of our own resources. Jesus said, "Unless, a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But, if it dies, it produces many

seeds. The man who loves his life will lose it, while the man who hates his life in this world will keep it... Whoever serves me must follow me." (John 12:24-26) Ask the Lord to help you be more willing to give up any dependencies that are hindering you from creatively visualizing all that God wants you to accomplish.

J. The Holy Spirit helps you creatively express your love, faith and hope in new ways every day. Jesus said to Peter, James and John, "Follow ME! And I will make you fishers of men." (Matt. 4:19) Ask the Lord to help you creatively express your love, faith and hope in NEW ways every day in every way so that you can be more like Jesus Christ.

III. It is all about the process of gaining The Right Perspective through the Holy Spirit of God.

A. H. A. Ironside, in his commentary on Ephesians, tells of a visit he had with an old, dying man named Andrew Fraser. Dr. Ironside writes:

"He could barely speak above a whisper, for his lungs were almost gone, but I can recall yet how, after a few words of introduction, he said to me, "Young man, you are trying to preach Christ; are you not?" I replied, "Yes, I am," "Well," he whispered, "sit down a little, and let us talk together about the Word of God."

He opened his well-worn Bible, and until his strength was gone, simply, sweetly, and earnestly he opened up truth after truth as he turned from one passage to another, in a way that my own spirit had never entered into them.

Before I realized it, tears were running down my face, and I asked, "Where did you get these things? Could you tell me where I could find a book that would open them to me? Did you learn these things is some seminary or college?"

Ironside said I shall never forget his answer. "My dear young man, I learned these things on my knees on the mud floor of a little sod cottage in the north of Ireland.

There with my open Bible before me, I used to kneel for hours at a time, and ask the Spirit of God to reveal Christ to my soul and to open the Word to my heart, and He taught me more on my knees on that mud floor that I ever could have learned in all the seminaries or colleges in the world."

Ironside then comments, "Is it not true that most of us do not stay long enough in the presence of God? We do not get quiet enough to let Him talk to us and reveal His mind to us".

B. Ask yourselves- Are you closer to God now then you were ten years ago?

It should be all our heart's desire to be able to answer that question with a resounding YES!
